

KATHMANDU – CHITWAN – POKHARA (08 NIGHTS/09 DAYS)

Culture, Heritage, Jungle Safari and Nature Tour

DAY 01: KATHMANDU


Arrival at Tribhuvan International Airport at Kathmandu. Meet your guide at the airport and Khada welcome then transfer to the Hotel. (Check in at 14:00).


Later Afternoon sightseeing of **Pashupatinath Temple** then see the Arati ceremony. (*Evening 'Aarati' at the banks of Bangmati River on the eastern side of the temple*). Pashupatinath is the most sacred Hindu shrines in the world. The richly-ornamented pagoda houses the sacred linga, or phallic symbol, of Lord Shiva. Chronicles indicate the temple's existence prior to 400 AD. Devotees can be seen taking ritual dips in the holy Bagmati river flowing beside the temple. Cremation of the dead body Hindus/Buddhist takes place at the bank of Bagmati River at Pashupatinath.



DAY 02: KATHMANDU

Morning sightseeing of **Kathmandu Durbar Square**, its old temples and palaces, epitomizes the religious and cultural life of the people. Here, the kings of Nepal are crowned and solemnized. Interesting things for visitors to see are Taleju temple, gigantic figure of Kalbhairav (the god of destruction), Basantapur Durbar and temple of Kumari (the residence of living goddess).











Chowk, the oldest one, is at the centre of Patan square. Several multi-sized and multi-styled temples occupy the western part of the complex. Main among these is Krishna Temple, Bhimsen Temple and the Golden Temple of Hiranya Varna.

DAY 03: KATHMANDU

Morning sightseeing of **Boudhanath**, The 36-meter-high stupa of Boudhanath is one of the largest stupas in South Asia. Here you can see many monasteries surrounding it. On each side is a pair of the all-seeing-eyes of the Buddha symbolizing awareness.

Afternoon **Bhaktapur Durbar Square**, It is also known as Bhadgaon and was founded in 889 AD by King Anand Dev. Today it covers an area of four square miles and is flanked by Khasa Khusung and Hanumante Rivers. The palace complex in the middle of the city portrays the prosperity of the Malla years and the details at which the crafts people then worked. The Palace of Fifty-five Windows stands in the square, which was also home to many kings of Bhaktapur.





Later sightseeing of **Thimi**, The city is more famous for its pottery and agricultural production.

DAY 04: KATHMANDU - CHITWAN (170 KM - 6 hrs approx)

Morning drive to Chitwan National Park. Lunch - Afternoon jungle activities - Village Walk. Dinner & Overnight.

DAY 05: CHITWAN NATIONAL PARK

Full day Jungle activities such as Jeep safari, Elephant briefing, Bird watching. Lunch - Jungle walk, Canoe ride etc. Evening Tharu stick dance and Dinner.



Morning drive to Pokhara. Pokhara is one of the most popular tourist destinations in Nepal, situated in the northwestern, at an altitude of 900 meters and 200 Km from the Kathmandu. Pokhara is also famous for beautiful lakes and magnificent views of the Annapurna, Dhaulagiri, Makalu, Manaslu, Machhapurche. Overnight.

DAY 07: POKHARA

Early morning drive to **Sarangkot** (1592 m) to for the sun rise and Mountain View (Weather Permit) then on the way back visit **Bindhyabasini Temple** & **Old Bazaar**. Afternoon visit **World Peace Stupa**, **Devi**"s **Fall**, **Tibetan Refugee Camp**, **Gupteshwor Cave** and boat ride on the **Phewa Lake** & visit **Barahi Temple**.









DAY 09: KATHMANDU

On time departure transfer to the airport.
