This maximum three-hour program is designed for you to experience the real traditional Sri Lankan rural village style.


Visit Polonnaruwa Ancient City (Entrance – Optional)

Visit Botanical Garden Peradeniya (Entrance – Optional)

The Royal Botanic Gardens in Peradeniya, Sri Lanka's Central Province, are about 5.5 kilometers west of Kandy. It is well-known for its orchid collection.

Nuwara Eliya

Also known as "Little England", the scenic town of Nuwara Eliya lies nestled in a valley more than 2500m above sea level and is surrounded by misty mountain ranges covered in pine forests and tea cultivations

The temple of Sita Amman is the only Hindu Temple in Sri Lanka dedicated to Sita. It is one of the major sites in Sri Lanka related with Ramayana epic.


