Amazing EGYPT Tour



Brief Itinerary

Day 01: Cairo International Airport - Hotel in Cairo

Day 02: Giza Pyramids, Sphinx, Egyptian Museum, Saladin Citadel and Coptic area of Cairo - Hotel in Cairo

Day 03: Cairo – Aswan for Nile Cruise (Visit: Philae temple, Aswan Dam, Aswan High Dam) - overnight stay on the boat

Day 04: Nile Cruise (Visit: Kom Ombo temple, Edfu, Luxor) - overnight stay on the boat

Day 05: Luxor (East Bank: Karnak temple, the Luxor temple, remains of an ancient Christian Church, the Abu Haggag Mosque, overnight stay on the boat

Day 06: Luxor (West Bank: Valley of the Kings, The Hatshepsut Temple) – Fly back to Cairo

Day 07: Hotel in Cairo - Cairo International Airport

Day 1: Arrival in Cairo, Egypt

Upon arrival at Cairo international airport, you will be met by our Airport representative, who will assist and transferred to your hotel to spend the night. Overnight at Hotel

Day 2: Giza Pyramids, Sphinx, Egyptian Museum, Saladin Citadel and Coptic area of Cairo (Hanging Church)

In the morning, after having breakfast at the hotel, you will be joined by our knowledgeable Egyptologist guide who will take you to the awe-inspiring Pyramids and Sphinx at Giza, which were constructed 4600 years ago. Khufu, the successor of Sneferu, was known for his arrogance and desire to build a tomb that surpassed all others in grandeur. The three Pyramids: Cheops (Khufu), Chephren (Khaфра) & Mycrenios (Menkaura). The Great Pyramid was constructed by King Cheops (IV Dynasty). King Chephren, the son of Cheops, built the second Pyramid and the third pyramid was built during the reign





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of “Menkaura”, the son of Chephren. The enigmatic Sphinx, with the face of Chephren and the body of a Lion, stands nearby as the guardian of the land of Pharaohs. The Sphinx and the three pyramids were once considered one of the Seven Wonders of the World. Afterward, we will visit the renowned Egyptian museum to view its precious antiquities. Then, we will explore the Islamic areas of Cairo, including the Citadel of Saladdin, which is home to the famous Alabaster Mosque of Mohammed Ali. Following that, we will visit the Coptic area of Cairo, where the Romans built the fortress of Babylon. Situated on the ruins of two fortress towers is the church of St. Mary, also known as the Hanging Church. We will also visit St. Sergius, believed to be the resting place of the holy family. Overnight at your hotel.

Day 3: Cairo – Aswan for Nile Cruise (Visit: Philae temple, Aswan Dam, Aswan High Dam) – overnight stay on the boat

Travel to Aswan and upon arrival, you will be greeted and transferred to your chosen cruise. Once settled in, you can opt for an afternoon excursion to the Philae temple. This island served as a significant pilgrimage site for followers of Isis and was believed to be under her protective gaze. Following the construction of the Aswan Dam, the temple was partially submerged, leading visitors to explore the remains by rowing boats. The Aswan High Dam, one of the largest dams globally, was then constructed to regulate the Nile's floodwaters, providing an overnight stay on the boat.

Day 4: Nile Cruise (Visit: Kom Ombo temple, Edfu, Luxor) - overnight stay on the boat

Embark on a leisurely breakfast cruise along the Nile River, taking in the serene scenery and tranquil ambiance. Visit the unique Kom Ombo temple dedicated to the gods Sobek and Horus, then continue sailing to Edfu to explore the renowned Horus Temple. Finally, settle in for an overnight journey to Luxor, anticipating the adventures ahead in this historic city.

Day 5: Luxor - East Bank: Karnak temple, the Luxor temple, remains of an ancient Christian Church, the Abu Haggag Mosque - overnight stay on the boat

Upon arrival in Luxor, enjoy breakfast before embarking on a tour of the East Bank. Visit the Karnak temple, which was the main center of worship in ancient Egypt, and the Luxor temple, dedicated to the god Amun and featuring impressive papyrus columns. Notably, the site also includes the remains of an ancient Christian Church and the Abu Haggag Mosque, representing three religions in one place. After the tour, you'll have a free afternoon and evening to relax on the boat before spending the night.

Day 6: Luxor (West Bank: Valley of the Kings, The Hatshepsut Temple) – Fly back to Cairo

In the early morning, we continued our tour in Luxor by visiting the West Bank, which includes the Valley of the Kings. This remote and barren area served as the necropolis for the New Kingdom pharaohs. By burying their tombs deep into the Theban Hills, pharaohs such as Tutmosis I aimed to prevent robbers from stealing their valuable possessions. The Hatshepsut Temple, set against a mountainous backdrop, is a stunning sight with its partly rock-hewn structure at Deir al-Bahri. The Colossi of Memnon, two enthroned statues of Amenhotep III, greet visitors upon arrival in the West Bank. We then flew to Cairo for an overnight stay.





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Day 7: Transfer to Cairo International Airport

Breakfast at the hotel then transfer to Cairo airport and farewell to the land of the pharaohs.
